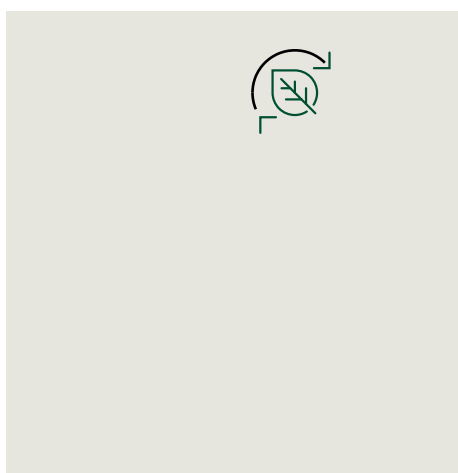
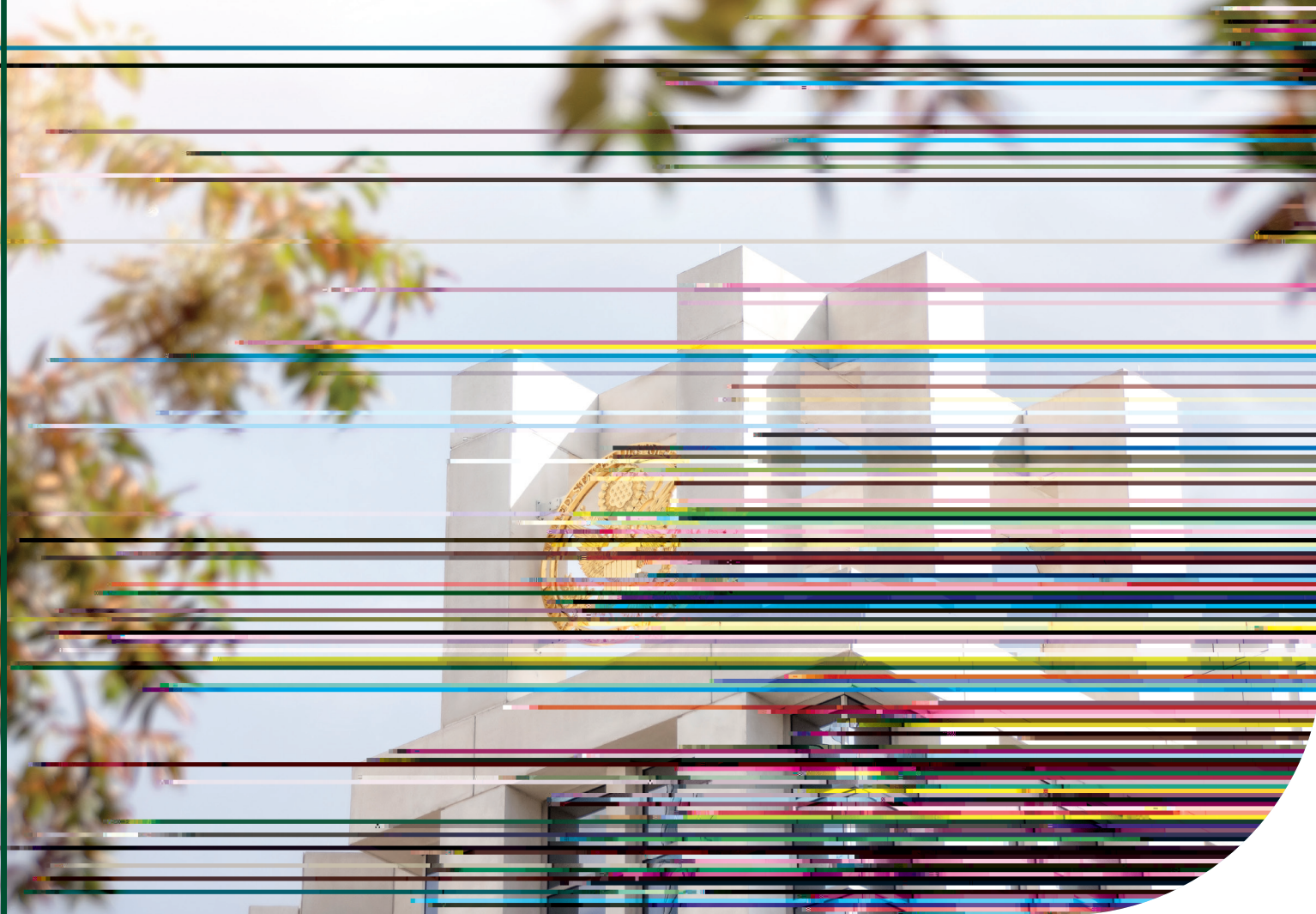




TX Active®: good, clean design
